Speaker Township Board Meeting Minutes

April 5, 2022

Meeting called to order Maitland @ 7:00 p.m., Five (5) Board members present

Pledge of Allegiance said

Approval of April 5, 2022 meeting agenda: Motion to approve April 5, 2022 Meeting Agenda made by Murray, second by Sheldon. Motion carried.

Approval of March 1, 2022 meeting minutes: **Motion to approve March 1, 2022 Meeting Minutes** made by Murray, second by Stanley. **Motion carried**.

Approval of March 2022 Treasurer's report: Sheldon(Treasurer) reviewed report advising that the last payments were made to the County and the bold amounts are what will be due from the county.

Motion to approve March 2022 Treasurer's Report made by Murray, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

Approval of March 2022 bills: Motion to approve March 2022 bills (Township bills \$2,683.38) made by Murray, second by Sheldon (Fire Dept. bills \$3,891.42) made Stanley, second by Murray & (Township payroll \$5,044.25) made by Murray, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

Grant Burgess (Grant Burgess Excavating, LLC) present to discuss options on improving the driveway at the Speaker Township Cemetery. Burgess presented a map of the driveway stating that there are sections that need to be cut down and graded prior to new gravel being put down. He stated that he would recommend limestone as it is cheaper than gravel right now. He inquired as to what level of grade is needed. Discussion held that 9' would be sufficient and looking at possibly 200 tons. Burgess will provide a quote by the May township meeting.

Cubitt(Clerk) advised Grant Burgess that she had been contacted by Kaatz Funeral Home and they wondered about when footings would be in place for a headstone placement. **Burgess** advised that it would be in May once the conditions improved with the ground.

Discussion held on the cemetery excavating contract and **Grant Burgess** agreed to renew the contract for another year. **Motion to renew the excavating services contract for the Speaker Township**Cemetery with Grant Burgess Excavating, LLC from March 1, 2022 to March 1, 2023 made by Stanley, second by Murray. **Motion carried**

<u>Public Comment</u>: (Present: Ben Steinhoff , Bonnie Sproul, David Sproul, Trevor Stone, Brian Mahaffy, Gerald Pathic, Caroline Pathic, Andrew Schuster, Grant Burgess, Joel Wyatt & Jan Priess)

Jan Priess inquired about the township sign and if the Board intended to install a new one.

Sheldon (Treasurer) stated it was being worked on and a new sign would be implemented. Cubitt (Clerk) advised that the pricing has changed and waiting to get current pricing from the company in order to move forward.

Fire Report: Stone(Fire Chief)

There were 5 total fire runs in March

Repairs were made on Engine 1 by replacing the air compressor unit. Tanker 2 had several air leaks and were adjusted. Batteries went bad on Tanker 1 and one the Rescue unit replaced and not under warranty.

Two new applicants for the fire department: **Kendall Paige Landry** & **Brandon Robert Gieleghem**. Both subjects have been background checked. They live in Yale and are currently in the Fire Fighter class, which should be done in October. Stone(Fire Chief) would like to hire each individual on as a Probationary Firemen.

Motion to approve the hiring of Kendall Paige Landry & Brand Robert Gieleghem on the Speaker Township Fire Department as Probationary Firemen made by Sheldon, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

MFR classes began last week with 10 attendees not just from Speaker Fire Department. There is an issue with the bandwidth size of the Internet for the training. It was not known that each attendee would need to access the internet with a device. **Stone**(Fire Chief) contacted Frontier and there is an option to increase the bandwidth for a few months to accommodate the training. He did not have the information needed to approve the upgrade. **Cubitt**(Clerk) will make contact with Frontier to try to get the problem resolved. **Stone**(Fire Chief) did contact Thumb Cellular to try to get some devices to assist with the internet issue but had not heard back from them yet.. **Maitland**(Supervisor) asked how long the training went and was advised approximately 7 weeks.

About ½ of the departments dress uniforms have arrived. Will be dispersed at next meeting.

Stone(Fire Chief) inquired to the garbage pickup schedule as the garbage big in full and has been for a few weeks. **Cubitt(**Clerk) advised Knox Disposal has been bought out by GLF Environmental and a call will be placed tomorrow to find out why the bin has not been emptied.

Planning Report:

Steinhoff(Planning Commission) advised that Planning member Jerry Rumenapp has resigned and a new member will need to be appointed. A public hearing was held on the golf course/campground special land use request on March 29, 2022. There were many in attendance and there was quite a bit of input. It was decided to have another meeting on April 4, 2022 to discuss restrictions and approval of the special land use. Debbie Kesteloot (Planning Commission Secretary) has the list of restrictions.

Maitland(Supervisor) inquired as to what happens next and Steinhoff(Planning Chairman) stated that Dean Hughes needs to produce the paperwork required within the restrictions to finalize the project. It mentioned that Attorney Brian Garner did not attend the meeting on April 4, 2022. Murray(Trustee) advised that Eric Alexander(Willow Tree Golf Course) was now in attendance and Eric advised that they would have the paperwork ready in a week or two and he will contact Supervisor Maitland with the information.

Discussion held with **Gerald & Caroline Pathic** on an issue that has been brought forward with their residential property being in a commercial district. They want to do a land split and were advised by the Tax Assessor that they cannot do according to the township ordinance. **Steinhoff**(Planning Chairman) advised that the commercial ordinance needs to be amended to include residential and he will email the lawyer to get the best course of action. More discussion ensued and **Maitland**(Supervisor) insured the **Pathic's** that the issue would be taken to the lawyer for a resolution.

Zoning Report: Sproul(Zoning Administrator) (SEE ATTACHED REPORT) read her report.

Township Agreement for Improvements for Local Roads:

Maitland (Supervisor) reviewed the contact with the Road Commission for general gravel patching on various roads at an estimated cost of \$20,000.00. Motion to Approve Agreement for Improvement on Local Roads with the Sanilac County Road Commission made by Murray, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

McIvor Lawn Care Contract for Township & Cemetery:

Maitland(Supervisor) read the bids presented by McIvor Lawn Care for the mowing of the township grounds and a for the mowing of the Speaker Township Cemetery (SEE ATTACHED for the 2022 season. Cubitt(Clerk) advised that the contract for the Speaker Township Cemetery was emailed and was not returned by McIvor Lawn Care prior to the meeting. The change in the cemetery contract is that instead of \$150.00 per mowing he is requesting a flat rate of \$4,000.00 for the year to mow the cemetery. Motion to Approve the McIvor Lawn Care bids for lawn care of the Speaker Township Hall and the Speaker Township Cemetery made by Sheldon, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

Burnham & Flower Insurance Group Par Plan bill \$13,657.00:

Supervisor(Maitland) reviewed the annual insurance bill advising it covers vehicles, buildings and personnel in the amount of \$13,657.00 Motion to Approve payment of the Burnham & Flower Insurance Group Par Plan bill in the amount of \$13,657.00 made by Murray, second by Sheldon. Motion carried.

Business CD Redemption:

Sheldon (Treasurer) stated that the 2 businesses in Speaker Township being Lone Oak Apple Orchard and the Good Tymes barn were made to put \$500.00 in a CD in lieu of a bond upon opening their business.

Both owners are requesting to cash in the bonds prior to maturity. They have filled out the proper paperwork and Sheldon (Treasurer) will be contacting the bank.

Replacement of E-Poll Book(Election Equipment):

Maitland(Supervisor) read the quote from Dell equipment in the amount of \$894.02 to replace the current election E-Poll Book. Cubitt(Clerk) explained that the E-Poll book was brand new in 2016 and the past few elections has had problems in turning on. The Sanilac County IT Director procured a bit for the township clerks with Dell under her contract with pricing at \$894.02. Motion to approve the purchase of a Dell Latitude 3520 laptop to replace the current Election E-Poll in the amount of \$894.02 made by Stanley, second by Murray. Motion carried.

Tax Assessor Contract Amendment: (SEE ATTACHED)

Maitland(Supervisor) advised the Tax Assessor contract was approved at the March1, 2022 township meeting at a rate of \$13.50 per parcel. At the township budget meeting held on March 22, 2022 a motion to increase the Tax Assessor per parcel rate from \$13.50 to \$14.50 per parcel was approved. This amendment addresses the change in the per parcel rate. Motion to approve the Tax Assessor Contract Amendment to reflect the increase from \$13.50 per parcel to \$14.50 per parcel made by Murray, second by Sheldon. Motion carried.

Brian Mahaffy(Liberty Power) announced that all board members and township residents were invited to the luncheon that was being held at the Speaker Township Hall on 04/06/2022 @ 12pm to 7pm. He stated this is the perfect opportunity to get questions answered on the windmill project in order to be able to education the residents.



Approval of February 1, 2022 meeting minutes: **Motion to approve February 1, 2022 Meeting Minutes** made by Murray, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

Approval of February 2022 Treasurer's report: Motion to approve February 2022 Treasurer's Report made by Stanley, second by Murray. Motion carried.

Sheldon(Treasurer) advised the ARPA fund account has been set up and will not see much activity until the second ARPA fund payment is received in the fall of 2022. Maitland(Supervisor) inquired as to what the 2nd payment amount would be and he was advised it would be \$64,050.50. **Sheldon**(Treasurer) stated that there was a small check received of left-over ARPA funds that was also deposited into the new account.

<u>Public Comment</u>: (Present: , Brenda Murray, Hughes, Bonnie Sproul, David Sproul, Brian Mahaffy & Jan Priess)

Priess(resident) mentioned that she did some research and the drain laws changed in March of 2021 and the Drain Commission is supposed to notify residents affected by drains via letter before doing the work and they have to disclose who requested the drain work, etc. She stated that COVID got in the way and the zoom meeting was held on the Sloat and Cole drain work. Maitland(Supervisor) stated he can't tell the Drain Commissioner how to do his job but he will make contact to remind them about the notification required prior to completing drain work.

Brian Mahaffy(Liberty Power) gave an update on the Windmill Project. Advised things are going well as they met with some landowners today and believes some turbine routing issues have been resolved. Maitland(Supervisor) mentioned gravel and asked about routes that would be needed. Mahaffy(Liberty Power) stated they are not there yet as they need to get the wind turbine locations set and then they will look at the routes and contact the township.

Fire Report: Stone(Fire Chief) absent. (SEE ATTACHED) Maitland(Supervisor) read fire report.

There were three runs all total in February.

We have completed and our site inspection and we are all set to host MFR class at the fire station. MFR classes will start on 4/1/22.

We are in the midst of having Front Line Services perform some repairs on the engine 1. It needs the onboard air compressor repaired and I was unable to obtain parts to fix it ourselves. They also repaired the on board compressor system on tanker 1 as it was not shutting off properly.

Tanker 1 also had the batteries short out due to age and Charlie replaced them today so we will see a bill for those.

I have also just serviced the fuel filter on the rescue truck.

I have also received notice from Bonnie that she is ready to move forward with the previously planned garage sale in June.

We had the uniform company out at our business meeting and the members that did not previously have a uniform were measured and uniforms ordered.

<u>Planning Report</u>: Steinhoff(Planning Commission) absent. Motion to approve Murray(Trustee) to give report made by Maitland, second by Cubitt.

Murray (Trustee) stated that a meeting was held last month to discuss and set the Public hearing date for Dean Hughes special land use permit for the campground. The meeting date was set for March 29, 2022. The notice will need to be posted in the paper and the letters notifying the residents will be going out. Murray (Trustee) stated that Planning Secretary (Deb Kesteloot) is currently working on the same.

Zoning Report: Sproul(Zoning Administrator) (SEE ATTACHED REPORT)

Sproul(Zoning Administrator) submitted report along with wording to be added to the Zoning Permit in reference to expiration language supplied by Attorney **Brian Garner.** Discussion held that wording looks appropriate and to discuss with Steinhoff(Planning Chairman) prior to implementation.
