Speaker Township Board Meeting Minutes

November 1, 2022

Meeting called to order Maitland @ 7:00 p.m., Five (5) Board members present.

Pledge of Allegiance said

Approval of Meeting Agenda: Motion to approve November 1, 2022 Meeting Agenda as presented made by Murray, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

Approval of October 4, 2022 Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve October 4, 2022 Meeting Minutes made by Maitland, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

Approval of October 14, 2022 Informational Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve October 13, 2022 Informational Meeting Minutes mad by Stanley, second by Murray. Motion carried.

Approval of October 2022 Treasurer's report: **Sheldon(**Treasurer) advised that tax collection has slowed down and about 142 parcels are uncollected at this time. Maitland(Supervisor) asked if those taxpayers now have to pay the taxes at the County Treasurer's office. Sheldon(Treasurer) advised she would still collect these taxes until the end of February/1st of March. **Motion to approve September 2022 Treasurer's Report made by Maitland, second by Murray. Motion carried.**

Approval of October 2022 bills:

Motion to approve October 2022 bills (Township bills \$26,918.17) made by Murray, second by Stanley(Fire Dept. bills \$582.62) made Murray, second by Sheldon, (Township payroll \$4,618.75) made by Murray, second by Stanley). Motion carried.

Fire Report: Jeff Withey(Assistant Fire Chief) read Fire Chief Stone's report:

We had two calls in October, with one being a PIA accident.

Carter Mechanical has declined to bid on the ceiling fan project for the fire hall. I have also been unable to get anyone else out to quote it; so as it stands AC/DC Electric is our only quote. I submitted that quote to the board last month. If you can advise how you'd like me to proceed that would be great. **Maitland**(Supervisor) requested to have AC/DC Electric provide a time frame on when the work could be completed.

Still no updates on our application is still active and it is.

We tried trunk or treat at the M19 hall last night and it was disappointing at best. We had around a dozen trick or treaters. Going forward we will be evaluating if we will continue to participate in trick or treating, as the last five years have been dismal.

We had another good turnout and experience at the Speaker Lone Oak Orchard for Orchard days. The new owners were very appreciative of our participation.

Some needed items are still on back order and have been all summer. New hose for the grass rig, and pump rebuild parts for the grass rig. It is still functional but it's my hope to be able to do the much needed repairs and upgrades this winter.

<u>Planning Report</u>: Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) advised that he and Tom Murray attended the County Planning meeting to review the Speaker Township Principal Permitted Uses Zoning Ordinance Amendment and approved for the Speaker Township Board to act upon.

Zoning Report: Sproul (Zoning Administrator) absent. Maitland read her report (SEE ATTACHED).

Old Business:

Approval of Speaker Township Principal Permitted Uses Zoning Ordinance Amendment 2022-01:

Maitland(Supervisor) read the Principal Permitted Uses Zoning Ordinance Amendment. It was explained that once the Board adopts the amendment a notice with a synopsis of the ZOA will be published in the newspaper with 15 days of adoption. The ZOA will go into effect 7 days after the notice of its adoption. Motion to approve Speaker Township Principal Permitted Uses Zoning Ordinance Amendment 2022-01 made by Murray, second by Stanley. Roll Call Vote: AYES: Sheldon, Stanley, Maitland, Cubitt & Murray. NAYS: 0 Motion carried.

Approval of Two(2) Planning Committee Members: Andrew Schuster & William McClarty:

Maitland(Supervisor) advised that two (2) members were being added to the Planning Commission being Speaker Township residents **Andrew Schuster** and **William McClarty** to the Speaker Township Planning Commission.

Motion to Appoint Andrew Schuster to the Speaker Township Planning Commission made by Sheldon, second by Stanley. Roll Call Vote: AYES: Sheldon, Stanley, Maitland, Cubitt & Murray. NAYS: 0. Motion carried.

Motion to Appoint William McClarty to the Speaker Township Planning Commission made by Sheldon, second by Stanley. Roll Call Vote: AYES: Sheldon, Stanley, Maitland, Cubitt & Murray. Nays: 0 Motion carried.

New Business:

Approve Payment of Sanilac County Drain Commission Assessment Bill (\$10,715.04):

Maitland(Supervisor) presented the Sanilac County Drain Commission Assessment bill in the amount of \$10,715.04. It was explained that the quote given to the Township in February was in the amount of \$9,866.37 and it is not uncommon for the final bill to be a bit higher as unexpected work was needed on some drains. Motion to pay the Sanilac County Drain Commission Assessment Bill in the amount of \$10,715.04 made by Murray, second by Stanley. Motion carried.

Approve Payment of Taylor Butterfield, P.C.:

Maitland(Supervisor) presented the monthly bill for legal fees from Taylor Butterfield, P.C. Motion to Approve payment of the Taylor Butterfield, P.C. bill in the amount of \$2,957.00 made by Maitland, second by Murray. Motion carried.

<u>Public Comment</u>: (Present: SEE ATTACHED SIGNATURE PAGES FOR ATTENDEES)

Maitland(Supervisor) advised Public comment would be limited to 3 minutes per person and requested for those able to respond to the podium and use the microphone. **Carolyn Fairman** responded to the podium and read a synapsis of the Planning Commission responsibilities in regards to setbacks, etc., and it is not too late to make changes to the windmill ordinance. She believes the ordinance should have been voted on by the residents. Once again opinions given by the residents present on how the township board has handled the windmill issue and accusations were made that all the board members are receiving financial gain in the form of a \$1,000,000.00 bribe.

Mary Angerbrandt approached the podium and handed a FOIA request to the township clerk for the minutes from the meeting where the \$1,000,000.00 bribe was discussed and that the Board had violated the Open Meetings Act. Murray(Trustee) tried to explain that no such meeting was held in Speaker Township and that the only time a million dollar payment was discussed by the windmill company was at an Informational meeting hosted by Liberty for the public. Cubitt(Clerk) reiterated that she was at no such meeting involving the windmills and therefore would not have any type of minutes. It was stated that in other areas they have donated a \$1,000,000.00 to the community.

Maitland(Supervisor) went on to elaborate that a philanthropic committee consisting of a township

Maitland(Supervisor) went on to elaborate that a philanthropic committee consisting of a township board member, school board member, non-participating landowner and participating landowner would be set up for community project funding. Cubitt(Clerk) interjected that **Steinhoff**(Planning Commission Chairman) needed to come forward to comment on this bribe issue as he started the issue at last month's meeting. Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) approached the podium and did state that he did not mean to mislead the public on the funding, but had heard that a \$1,000,000.00 was being given to the township by the windmill company. Fairman(Public) interjected that Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) did not say anything about a bribe. Cubitt(Clerk) stated that the bribe issue was brought up to the County Board of Commissioners today and Fairman(Public) stated that she did say that today, but she reiterated that Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) did not say those words. Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) did state that he would be willing to work with an advisory committee to look at amendments to the current wind ordinance. The public requested that the township Board be receptive to the same. Joel Wyatt(Current County Commissioner) spoke up to say that it is not too late in the process to make amendments and that Fremont Township recently did the same. Maitland (Supervisor) stated that was within the right of the Planning Commission to create the committee. Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) asked if the Board would be receptive to changes before going to all the work. Maitland(Supervisor) stated the Board would look at whatever the Planning Commission presents, but that due to conflict with Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) signing up with Liberty Power that he may have to recuse himself from some of the discussions in this area. Steinhoff(Planning Commission Chairman) stated he would step down from his position and it was discussed that it was not necessary.

Concerns by the Public that Liberty Power has not answered the questions that have been submitted to them. **Maitland**(Supervisor) stated that the Board is waiting as well for questions to be answered.

Marilyn **Strickler**(Public) approached the podium and read a statement that the township board has let the community down, a new township attorney is needed, and **Tom Murray**(Trustee) needs to resign from the board for his participation with the windmill company. There needs to be a demonstrated need for wind energy and Speaker Township does not have a need.

Gerald Pathic(Public) approached the podium to get clarification on what meeting the \$1,000,000.00 bribe was mentioned and upon receiving that money questioned whether the township would need to vote for the township millages any longer.

John Moody(2023 District 7 Commissioner) approached the podium to introduce himself. He will be attending all meetings and will represent Speaker Township, Fremont Township, Worth Township, and the Village of Melvin starting in January 2023. Sanilac County resident his whole life and he is retired from the Sheriff's Office after 28 years.

Joel Wyatt (County Commissioner) approached the podium advising that he has been a county commissioner for years and he believes in accountability. It is the nature of humans to want change after something bad happens rather than planning ahead. All residents are responsible to be aware of what is going on in their area. There are laws on publication, public hearings, etc. that have been followed.

Joel Wyatt(County Commissioner) gave an update of what transpired at the County Board meeting today. The County Board approved to use \$1.2 million of the ARPA funds to retire the jail bond debt, which would free up funds to be put in a maintenance fund for repair of old county buildings.

Maitland(Supervisor) asked how much of the \$8 million was left after the jail payment. Wyatt(County Commissioner) stated roughly \$6.2 million. Sanilac County has a committee that is tasked with looking at ways to spend the money and some funds have been allocated for other needs.
